Marie Kindrick, for whom the award is named, was a remarkable person who committed herself to working for the rights of the under-represented for nearly sixty years. Born into a wealthy New England family, Marie defied convention and expectation and made her life a testament to the kind of work that we honor with this award. As a young woman, she sat on the San Francisco committee to establish the United Nations. In the 1930's she joined the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People. She was also a charter member of the United World Federalists and for half a century an active member of the League of Women Voters. As a Realtor in our community, working for Roth Realty, she was a volunteer tutor for the DABR Partners in Education at Ruskin School as well as a teacher of English as a second language in Kettering schools. She served on the Equal Opportunity Committee from 1992 until her untimely passing in May of 1998. The Dayton Area Board of Directors and the Equal Opportunity and Diversity Committee pay tribute to Marie and honor her for the inspiration for all of us to work for fairness and equity for everyone.
